


Alabama Drinking Water Supplies Downstream from Coal Ash Impoundments

Graduated symbols are used to show the relative size of populations served by surface water intakes to drinking water systems. Population served includes primary systems and the secondary systems that purchase water from them. Only public drinking water intakes known to be downstream of coal ash ponds have been shown. Some systems have multiple intakes, despite having only one point on the map. Figures are based on EPA's SDWIS for the intake system and secondary systems that purchase from the intake system. Connections within and between water systems are often complicated, so for the most accurate information, contact the local water authority.
